Dear Madam Clerk,

For many months, Cambridge Presbyterian Church has been prayerfully trying to discern the Lord's will for us in how we might best bless the community with our Unity Center (the former Unity Presbyterian Church building and property). We've opened the building for ecumenical services and ministry groups in need of space. We've had leadership meetings and a prayer meeting seeking the Lord's will. In September 2024 we held a congregational meeting to discuss the possible broad options before us. At that meeting, the congregation authorized the Session to form a committee to explore the sale of Unity Center. That committee did a lot of work, getting the property appraised, talking with two local churches looking for a building. Neither of those options worked out. Ultimately, the committee recommended putting the property on the market, which Session approved in January. Through the Realtor, another congregation made an offer on the property yesterday, and would like to close in May, if possible. Since Presbytery does not meet again until June, we wanted to come before Presbytery prior to our Congregational Meeting. In accordance with Book of Order, G-4.0101 and G-4.0206a, we are requesting approval to sell the Unity Center property, pending congregational approval.
